

Hurricane Matthew blew torrential winds and rain through the southern Caribbean and hardly a single life was lost...until it turned north and hit the southwest coast of Haiti. In one day it caused total destruction of major cities, towns and villages. 90% of all houses destroyed. ALL trees (read mango, avocado, breadfruit, orange, etc) destroyed. ALL animals killed. ALL gardens destroyed. And so far over 1,000 people dead and the toll keeps rising. You couldn't make a horror movie that would be worse than this reality.

Here in Port-au-Prince we had wind and rain but it did almost no damage in the area where we live. So we have access to all food and supplies as usual, and many of the aid organizations are filling helicopters and trucks as fast as they are able. Still we're talking about an unimaginable immediate need for at least 100,000 displaced people.





We are not a disaster relief organization, so I was not expecting to be asked how a person could help with this terrible situation. It has also become known to us how many Haitian ministry partners and beloved friends have family living in the disaster zone who have lost everything and are suddenly homeless, without food, without clothes, and desperate. Although Digicel just re-established cell service to parts of the disaster region, there is no electricity so most people cannot charge their phones, which means families here have no way to know if their loved ones are alive. This morning I sent our employee Misha with some cash to go to Les Cayes and find his mother, father, three sisters, and baby daughter. This afternoon I gave one of the young guys I mentor what he needed to send rice and beans to his family who have lost everything and are sleeping on the floor of an orphanage. And there are more, people we know and love, who are coming to us in the most desperate need.





We are receiving contributions for DISASTER RELIEF, and we will spend 100% of gifts so designated for that purpose only: food, supplies and transportation.

This need is time-critical, as I'm sure you understand.
